

Dos Cabezas Mountains Naturalist Saunter



Perched just north of their famous sister range, the Chiricahuas, are the little-visited Dos Cabezas Mountains or “2 Heads”. Despite their smaller size the Dos Cabezas contain a beauty and solitude all their own. Ethnobotanist, Naturalist, and Wildlife Biologist Vincent Pinto will lead a few slow-paced, in-depth Naturalist walks within one major canyon of the Dos Cabezas. Enjoy a leisurely exploration of the natural history and geology of the mountains. Walking amidst otherworldly granite boulders and cliffs you’ll learn about the local native plants and wildlife, including the Jaguar recently spotted here! Vincent will discuss the ample evidence of Native American cultures in the way of artifacts. As an added bonus Vincent, an expert Wilderness Survival Instructor, will demonstrate several ancient survival skills in the context of these vanished people. ***Distance: 3 miles roundtrip. Terrain: varies from flat & easy to rocky & moderate, sometimes walking on large rocks with a moderate pitch and between boulders. Level: Easy.***
