

# Atascosas Naturalist Saunter



Among our various Sky Island mountain ranges several smaller ones generally fall under the radar of most explorers. Such is often the case with the Atascosas. With few trails, yet a wide range of beautiful places to investigate they promise new discoveries and hidden gems. With this in mind we'll venture to a number of little-visited canyons, woods, and riparian areas that host diverse native plants and wildlife. Due to their proximity to Mexico, the Atascosas are prime for tropical wildlife surprises, such as Elegant Trogon, Five-striped Sparrow, and Jaguar. They also are a know spot for Golden Eagles, Mountain Lions, Brown Vine Snakes and other fascinating species. Additionally, the range is rife with dramatic rock outcrops and formations sure to wet your geologic appetite. Naturalist and Wildlife Biologist Vincent Pinto will be your guide for this series of slow-paced walks in this magnificent range. Total roundtrip walking distance will be about 3 miles.
